The Wellington Trust was set up in 2005 to maintain and preserve HQS Wellington which is moored on the Thames opposite Temple tube. She is the last of her kind, a WWII convoy ship with 103 missions safeguarding the merchant ships bringing much needed supplies to our shores. Our mission is education and we open the ship to the public each year on Sundays and Mondays. This year, in addition to the artefacts and models, and seeing life on a real warship, we have an exhibition on board – South Asian Seafarers, and Augmented Reality attractions to entertain and educate. We'll be open as soon as SAGE advises the Government that it is safe to do so, and we have full Covid protection in place.
